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# VA Priorities Going Into 2024

### Mental Health Services in FY 24

#### \$155.6 million in additional spending

- \$58 million to create crisis receiving centers
- \$34 million for permanent supportive housing
- \$11.7 million for school and community-based services for children
- \$10 million for additional mobile crisis teams
- \$8.4 million for increased funding for STEP-VA and the Virginia Mental Health Access Program
- \$18 million for a targeted pay increase averaging 5% for all CSB staff

Localities play a major role is distributing the funds needed to secure ample social services in their area



#### Medicaid Increases

- Amendments add a \$42.8 million GF and \$49.4 million NGF for Medicaid and other health care rate increases beginning January 1, 2024
  - \$20.8 million GF and \$23.6 million NGF to increase rates for personal care attendants
  - \$8.7 million GF and \$18.5 million NGF for a 10% increase in rates for community mental health services
  - \$7.3 million GF to increase the Auxiliary Grant rate from \$1,609 to \$2,055 per month for low income aged and disabled individuals residing in assisted living facilities
  - \$5.2 million GF and \$5.9 million NGF to increase supplemental physician payments for the Children's Hospital of the King's Daughters
- Provides 500 additional Medicaid Developmental Disability waiver slots, beginning January 1, 2024 (in addition to the 600 slots that became available July 1, 2023)
- Adds \$9.5 million for health workforce initiatives to help address the critical nursing and behavioral health work shortages
- Reflects \$259.3 million GF of technical savings reflecting the most recent Medicaid expenditure forecast and revenue estimate for the Virginia Health Care Fund, and the final months of the enhanced federal match rate




#### HB 2192 - Catawba Hospital - Study

Out in SWVA we are working to create a state-of-the-art facility at Catawba Hospital to combat the ever-prominent opioid crisis.

The DBHDS data analysis showed that between 35% and 55% of all patients at the three hospitals (Western State Hospital, Catawba Hospital and Southwestern Mental Health Institute) had SUD and a mental health illness, and only 10% of the patients were diagnosed with SUD with no underlying mental illness. After fully analyzing the IBM/Watson data and the DBHDS historical data, it was determined that there is a need for approximately 100 – 150 Acute Behavioral Health Beds, 80 - 120 residential SUD treatment beds and 16 Detox Beds in the surrounding Catawba Hospital area through 2030.

Southwest Virginia has a need for increased services to treat mental health and substance use disorders across the region.



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
#### Integration of CSBs in Public Education
