Fast Facts for Community Service Boards

Virginia Cities and Counties are Receiving Funds

- From settlements with companies in the opioid pipeline
- Total Virginia projected to receive over 18 years - **\$1,000,000.00**

These Settlement Funds are:

- An opportunity to partner with Cities and/or Counties to expand and/or add services and programs in communities to help citizens with or at risk of developing opioid use disorder (OUD)
- To be used for opioid abatement purposes
- Eligible to be directly awarded to Cities, Counties, and State Agencies
 - CSBs must partner with one of these entities and may serve as a partner, sub-recipient, and support the management of the funds

These Settlements Funds *are not*:

- State General Funds, Federal Funds, or Federal Grants
- Eligible to be directly awarded to CSBs

CSBs must partner with cities and/or counties they serve to receive funds

Offering to handle the grant writing and management for cities & counties can help

If a CSB only serves a few cities/counties, consider partnering with other CSBs & their jurisdictions

Key Items for Partnering with Cities and Counties

- Partnering usually requires reaching out to the city or county executive's office
- May involve presenting the project to the governing body
- Start early in the process (It takes time to pull everything together and get approval from governing bodies)
- Don't wait until 2 weeks before the deadline to start working on the application itself
- If locality is awarded a grant, an MOU may need to be executed between the CSB and locality
- Locality is ultimately responsible for what happens with the funds
- Locality may grant access to OAA Grant Portal for CSB personnel

Key Financial Items for Developing OAA Applications

- Involve budget/finance staff along with program staff from your CSB and your cities/counties
- Important when completing the project's budget and locality's Direct Distribution report.
- Localities cannot supplant funds for existing programs/positions
- You want to submit a project that is both programmatically and financially sound
- Long-term projects need to be self-sustaining without OAA funds with options including:
 - increasing matching funds
 - leveraging generated revenues
 - combining with other grants, etc.

Key Program Items for Developing OAA Applications

- Projects are required to be new and/or enhancements to an existing project
- Be realistic and honest with proposals
- Proposed performance measures and implementation timeline need to be realistic and achievable
